Buy A Kid Breakfast

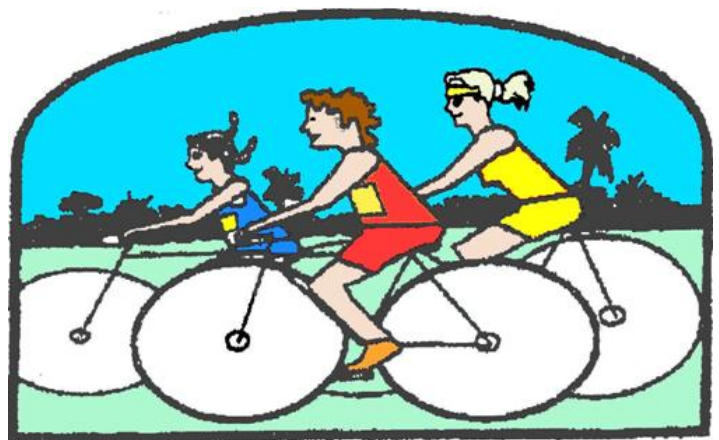

5. The programme is kept anonymous to prevent embarrassment to the kids.

Double honour for PP Paul de Freitas

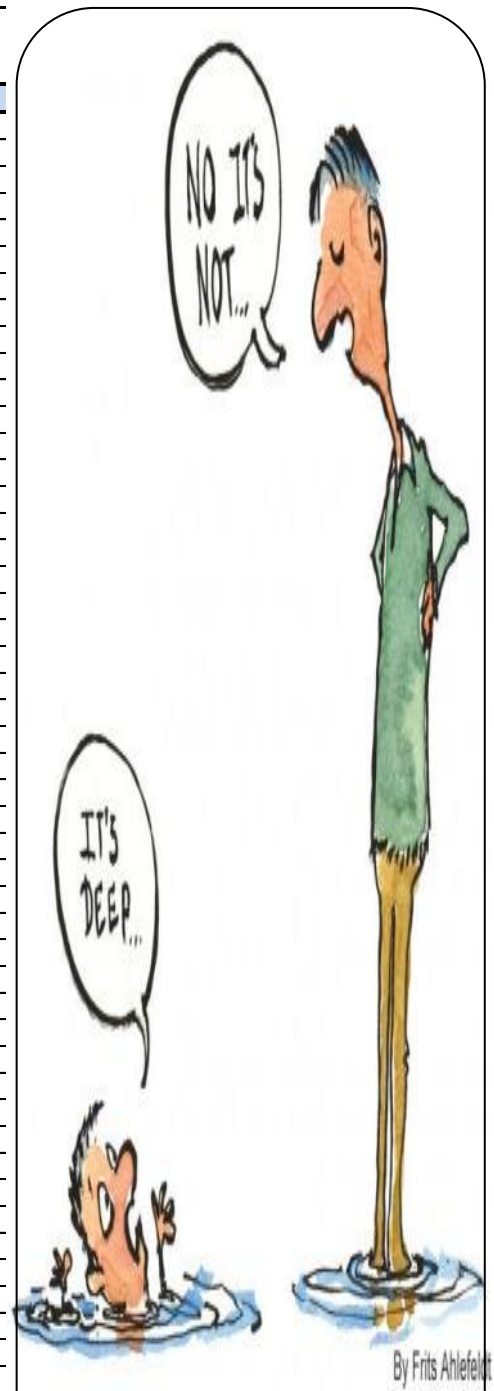
