Although the girls outnumber the boys in their attendance at every Key Leader, Neith and Kenroy, two of our Student Facilitators, have attended Key Leader four times. In addition, feedback from all male participants is very positive. Therefore we need to look at ways using past attendees to influence prospective new ones. Perhaps our programme of Key Leader recaps will be the key to unlock this aspect.


