So What Was 2010 All About? A Commentary

During 2010, our club has been very blessed in having two presidents with very contrasting styles but with one core value - getting it done by whatever means for the children of the Cayman Islands. PP Mario and P Wiekert exhibit the trait of "If I can't get someone to do it, I'll do it myself".

The presidential workload during 2010 has not been made any easier by the continued absence of certain members whose talents and time could have made our presidents' tasks a little easier. It is a shame, and a sham, and it is time for these members to be true Kiwanians or leave us.

The Kiwanis Club Of Grand Cayman does not exist to look good on a Curriculum Vitae or on a Residency or job application. It exists to serve the community doing real hands-on work which may involve one-on-one collections from our community for the funds we need to do what we do, or one-on-one reading with a child who needs help to develop his or her reading skills, or a one-on-one relationship with the com-

munity through Santa Landing at which event we had a pretty poor turn-out of our members.

PP Mario's efforts in pulling together the Santa Landing event with an extremely small committee and a bare minimum of pre-event assistance was praiseworthy. But a little of the gloss on the event was not there because one person cannot do everything - and for an event the size of Santa Landing, planning and preparation needs to involve more people earlier with a fully committed membership to turn out for the event.

P Wiekert faced a similar problem with our flagship teen event - Key Leader - at which a very small number of Kiwanians were present to provide much needed assistance and supervision. This meant that a few suffered a heavy workload and burned many hours which would have been an unnecessary burden if more Kiwanians had spent an hour or two at the event.

So what was 2010 all about. Why has our club had reduced K

numbers at these and other crucial events such as the mobile library? What is it about life in 2010 which has perhaps forced us to give less time to the Kiwanis Club Of Grand Cayman? And what of those members who, without any obvious good reason have less than 4 hours per month and who do not attend our lunches?

These questions must be addressed by the board and necessary changes made so that those who prefer only to support us financially can do so without criticism for lack of service.

I personally envisage a new class of membership based on the various Kiwanis foundations - a Sustaining Member - and persons in this class should pay a membership fee which in part provides for the day to day running of our club, in part pays into our Kiwanis Helping Kiwanis foundation, and the remainder goes to the general Community Service budget. This is one way, but not the only way. But something has to change and we need to talk about it. [PP P de F]
