Why We Should Be Supporting **ELIMINATE**...



Hey, buddy, got a spare \$110 million? If so, Kiwanis International and UNICEF need you.

Older members will remember that the organisation Kiwanis teamed with UNICEF to ensure that iodine was added to common salt during the manufacturing process in order eliminate serious to birth defects in babies. By simply ensuring that women ate salt treated with iodine the disease was eliminated. That project tackled Iodine Deficiency Disorder.

Now, Kiwanis and UNICEF want to target Maternal and Neonatal Tetanus (MNT), disease a which steals the lives of nearly 60,000 innocent babies and a significant number women each year. The effects of the disease are excruciating tiny newborns suffer repeated, painful convulsions and extreme sensitivity to light and touch.

To eliminate MNT from the Earth by 2015, 129 million mothers and their future babies must be immunized. This requires vaccines, syringes, safe storage, transportation, thousands of skilled staff and more. will take \$110 million — and the dedicated work of UNICEF and every member of the Kiwanis family. The project will reach the poorest, most neglected mothers and babies with lifesaving additional health care.

The end of this disease means the beginning of better health for so many families.


