There has been no newsletter for the last two weeks. During this time, two significant events have taken place and one might ask, why no newsletter? Why was the visit by K. Kadi Merren meets with Governor Elect Eddie Lee



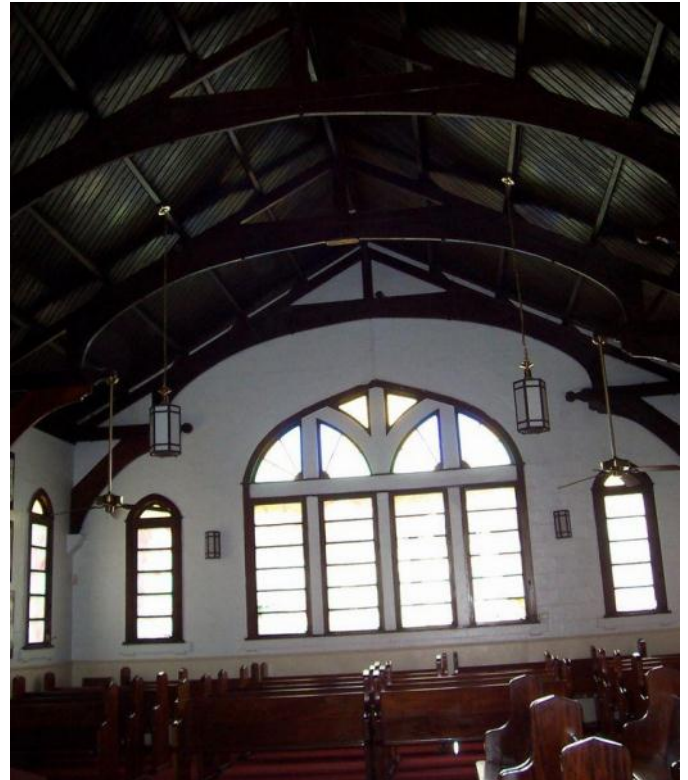

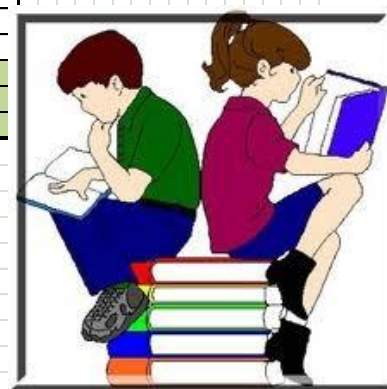
