31st KiwaniBike A Success

Past President Monique Bush took back her role as KiwaniBike chair as soon as her year as President of our club ended. It was decided to move the event to early in the year when the weather is cooler and this paid off with a stiff nor'wester which guaranteed that the riders would definitely earn their sponsorship money.

Bright and early on Sunday 17th February, crews of Kiwanians and Key Clubbers arrived at the Blow Holes at East End, at Smith Cove in South Sound, and at water stops between. Over 40 riders had preregistered. 30 more signed on to bring the sponsored ride total to some 72 riders plus the usual bike club hangers on. President Kadi was the sole Kiwanis rider and also represented PwC.

William McTaggart Jr of Uncle Bill's donated a bicycle drawn for by riders contributing C\$100 or more. The lucky winner was Rebecca Redford who had brought C\$157 in sponsorship to the event.

Of course, KiwaniBike attracts corporate sponsors and the following were the recipients of special certificates: Greatest Value of Pledges Collected: British Caymanian Insurance Co. Ltd;

Greatest number of riders: British Caymanian Insurance Co. Ltd; and joint winners of the KiwaniBike trophy for the Greatest Contribution per Employee were Pestkill (14/CIS\$500) and CI Helicopters (7/CIS\$250). They share the trophy for six months each.

Finally, for the third year in a row, David Clarke was the individual rider collecting the greatest value of pledges at C\$743 and we thank him for raising over C\$2000 for Kiwanibike over the last few years.

Major sponsors Dart Group and Island Heritage ensured a good start to the fund-raiser with generous donations of C\$1,000 each,

Thank you to Lucie, our Book-Mobile volunteer for coming out and helping, to Lemmie's Trucking and Majestic Tours for truck and buses. And to Kiwanians for coming out to man the start, and the finish—you know who you are. An event like Kiwanibike needs manpower and you made it happen with your efforts. And this year, the more than C\$6100 raised will go to support our Key Clubbers who are heading for convention in Florida.
