It was a great honour and privilege for me to serve as your President; and despite a number of challenges, it was reassuring to have the support of dedicated Kiwanians. I would like to take this opportunity to say a special thank you to Daniella, Ruud and Kadi for their time, advice and efforts despite their busy schedules.

This year the Kiwanis Club of Grand Cayman celebrated its 40th Anniversary and Kiwanis International celebrated its 100th anniversary so it was a special year for us. Kiwanis celebrated with a Membership Drive/Awareness campaign early in the year, a 'Dress for a Cause' day on

Friday July 31st and an All White 40th Anniversary Gala on the 21st of March at which we raised 4848. The money primarily went towards funding a new project. This project was a Kiwanis grant of \$500 which was donated to a Key Club graduate from the Triple C School and John Gray High School recognizing outstanding service. I hope to see this project develop and continue for many years to come.

Summarizing our projects this administrative year, with over 300 attendees Santa Landing 2014 was a delightful way start of the Christmas season. Santa and his helpers gifted all children with books. We had a successful Key Leader program in 2014 with 48 students and this year we had a record 67 students. Well done, a special recognition of Kadi, Linda and Marnu must be made for their efforts. We donated approximately \$1,400 towards the Elimi-Our annual Pancake nate Project. breakfast was well received and well attended this year, raising \$1082 all going towards our Buy a Kid Breakfast Programme.

The Key Clubs have continued to be successful and Dominique, as Lieutenant Governor impressed me with her dedication, you can definitely see her growth with this experience. At the 2015 Key Club District Leadership and Education Conference in Orlando, Florida she received three awards for her contributions as Lieutenant Governor. We raised \$7702 from Kiwani Bike which all went towards our Key Clubbers. Our Kiwanians who participated as riders surely did shine, well done Marnu, Daniella and Martina!

Kiwanis launched the Bring Up Grade Programme at Sir John A Cumber Primary school this year; this is the second school in which we have this program. This program encourages students to focus on making small accomplishments at a time and it is aimed at students who are not always the highest achievers. On May 18th Kiwanis hosted a K-family fun day, the first since 2010. This day

brought together members from our 5 Key Clubs, Circle K and Kiwanians for a day of games, food and fun.

Kiwanis was chosen as one of the three charities to take part in the Island Heritage's Charity Day. We received a cheque for \$10,000 which all went towards funding the 2015 Key Leader.

Kiwanis Book Mobile received a facelift and additional resources with a generous donation of \$11,000 from RBC. We are also happy to have Ogier commit \$15,000 towards our Breakfast Programme; we received the first instalment of 5,000 in July. We are grateful to Nicola for facilitating this.

Kiwanis sponsored the Child Month Cupcake War working along with the Department of Children and Family Services and Youth Services Unit. President Daniella was invited to be a judge and it was something exciting and new for Kiwanis to be involved in, given our aim to make 40 donations in celebration of our 40th Anniversary this year.

I am happy to report to date we have made 46 donations, 21 of which were to our Buy a Kid Breakfast Programme.

In total this year we raised around \$83,600 and donated \$75,646 with over \$36,000 of that going to our Buy a Kid Breakfast Programme.

We installed 4 new members this year and hope that we have lived up to our commitment to them and are thankful for their service and efforts.

As I mentioned previously Kiwanis is celebrating its 40th Anniversary this year. At the beginning my presidency members were excited to set a goal of attaining at least 40 hours of service for this year in keeping with this theme. The following were recognized with certificates for their efforts in achieving this; Sue Day, Paul DeFreitas, Linda Chapman Key, Venesha McLean, Marnu van Rensburg, Monique Bush, Heather Lanigan, Daniella McGowan, Nicola Murray, Roger Bodden, Jodi Williams-Wisdom, Kadi Merren-Pentney and Ruud van der Pluijm.

Lastly, thank you to each and every one of you for taking part in a phenomenal year and continuing to dedicate your time to the kids of Cayman.



#### #kidsCARE at Book Mobile


